# Feng Shui Tip

## Feng Shui for Dorms and Small Apartments

Do you have a student in your family going back to a dorm room this fall? For students, especially freshmen, moving into dorm rooms that may not be quite as comfortable as their bedrooms back home can be quite unsettling. The same can be said for people starting out in their first small apartment or one-room efficiency. Here are five easy Feng Shui steps to help ease the transition:

- 1. **Clear Clutter**. Clutter represents postponed decisions and the inability to move forward, so be careful where you pile and file things. Try to buy furniture that doubles as storage space, such as an ottoman that opens so you can store your towels and sheets.
- 2. Add Plants. Place a living plant within 3 feet of your computer to help balance any electromagnetic fields (EMFs) that it generates. Choose plants with rounded leaves since they represent wealth, but avoid cactus

and other spiky plants that repel energy.

- 3. **Position Your Bed Correctly.** Avoid sleeping with your feet facing directly out the door, which is considered the most inauspicious position for sleeping. If you can't move your bed, place a piece of furniture, a shawl, or other soft fabric near the end of the bed for cushioning.
- Decorate Your Space with the Five Elements. Use a balance of colors and shapes of the Five Elements to decorate your space (Fire, Earth, Metal, Water, Wood) and balance the energy. See the <u>Basics</u> section of my website for more on the Five Elements.
- 5. **Clean Your Windows.** Windows are considered the "eyes" of a building so when they are dirty your vision is clouded. Clean your windows occasionally so you can clearly see your future. And be sure to open your windows frequently to let in positive chi.

#### The Power of Eight

Even if you watched only a few Olympic events last month you got a taste of how important the number eight is in Feng Shui and to the Chinese people. The games started on 08/08/08 at 8:08pm because the number eight is considered lucky since it sounds like the Chinese word for prosperity. And eight was certainly lucky for American swimmer Michael Phelps, who will continue to turn his eight gold medals into wealth through product endorsements and other deals.

What do you think? Try using the number eight in your life and see what happens. Use it in one of your online passwords, for a personalized license plate, or in your bank PIN and see if it can bring some prosperity and wealth into your life.

There were many other Feng Shui symbols at the Olympics. For example, the square shape of the Water Cube represented the Earth Element to help balance the water inside it. The undulating shape of the "Bird's Nest" stadium represented the Water Element to help balance the grass and field. A corner of the Bird's Nest pointed directly at the NBC broadcast area and this poison arrow was "cured" by a Feng Shui practitioner to assure a successful broadcast

# **Clutter Clinic**

#### **Organizing Your Garage**

Does your car actually fit in your garage? If you answered "no" it's time to start thinking about Fall-cleaning in that space. Here is some organizing advice to cut through the clutter and put your garage in good order:

**Decide on a purpose for your garage.** For example, in addition to parking your cars do you need to use it as a workshop, keep an extra refrigerator or freezer in there, or does it need to serve as a laundry room? Will you store toys and sporting equipment? Your answers will help organize it.

**Spend 20-30 minutes a day sorting.** Set a timer or put on a piece of music and start in one area deciding what you will keep and what you will toss or recycle. As you sort, ask yourself: Do I love it? Do I need it? When is the last time I used it? Is it outgrown, broken, and otherwise obsolete? If I donated it to charity, would someone get good use out of it? The answers will help you decide whether an item is a keeper.

Assign a home to everything you are keeping. Store your things in areas by category, such as all the tools together, all the toys together, and all the gardening items together. The easier it is to put something away, the more likely it is to get done.

*Label everything.* Not only will this help you and other family members identify what is in your boxes and containers, but labeling shelves and cabinets can also help encourage everyone to put the item back in its place.

*Create portable collections.* Use various size containers or buckets to organize the things you store so you can pick up your "fix it" bucket, or "car wash" bucket, or "electrical repair" bucket and take it to where you need it, then put it back in its place.

**Use all of your space.** A garage can be damp and spills are always possible so protect your belongings by storing them off the ground. When you can't expand out into the garage, try expanding up by using the walls for storage. Also, consider investing in a lift mechanism so you can store some things near the ceiling.

# Feng Shui Q& A

Q: I share an office and my colleague wants to hang a world map on the wall behind me. I don't mind the idea of the map but I want to know if that's the place for it. A: The ideal place to locate a map or globe is in the Knowledge/Wisdom area of the room. To find that area, stand outside the entrance to your office looking in. The Knowledge/Wisdom area is in the lower left corner. You can download bagua mapping charts from my website to take to your office to help figure out where this area is in your space: <u>FengShuiForRealLife.com/Basics</u>.

**Q:** Our business is located in a strip mall and there is a large trash container located right in front of the door. I'm thinking that this is not a good Feng Shui symbol. **A:** I am afraid I have to agree that having a trash can in front of your main entrance door is not conducive to attracting positive chi into your business. Ask the landlord if the trash can be relocated to another area. If that's not possible, make sure you are vigilant about assuring that management empties the trash frequently. You could also consider hanging a bagua mirror or any convex mirror above your entrance door to reflect the negative chi associated with the trash away from your business. In an article in the *Philadelphia Inquirer* headlined "Pillow Talk," reporter Patricia Rivera poses the question "How many pillows does it take to create your perfect bed?" and quotes me in the answer:

Feng Shui practitioner and consultant Carol M. Olmstead isn't sure that a large number of pillows is a good thing. She says that having too many pillows on your bed can send the wrong message to a partner and disrupt the balance and harmony she's helping her clients achieve in their homes.

"You simplify your life with fewer pillows. You don't have to worry about keeping them clean and off the floor," she says.

## **Preventing Identity Theft**

Almost 9 million Americans are victims of identity theft each year. That's a staggering number, but you can take some simple steps to help reduce your risk of becoming the next victim. The first step is reviewing your credit card and bank statements as soon as they arrive to monitor for unauthorized transactions, and contacting your bank or credit card if a statement is late. Here are a few other things you can do:

- Avoid giving out your personal information over the Internet or phone unless you have initiated the contact. Identity thieves are skilled at posing as representatives from banks, credit card companies, and the government.
- Use intricate passwords for your e-mail and Internet accounts, combining numbers with capital and lowercase letters; avoid easily guessed passwords like your birth date, maiden name, or phone number.
- Shred all documents that show your personal information.
- Avoid leaving outgoing mail in your home mailbox where it can easily be stolen; instead drop it directly into a postal box.
- Cancel credit cards you don't use, and be sure to tell the company to make a note that the "card was cancelled at the cardholder's request" in your file.
- Keep your Social Security card in a safe place rather than carry it with you; try to use an alternative form of identification wherever possible.
- Turn on SPAM filters for your e-mail, and be suspicious of any e-mail that asks for personal or account information.
