

Feng Shui Tip For November: Create Thanksgiving Harmony



The colors, aromas, and tastes of Thanksgiving are strongly associated with positive Feng Shui. However, this family and food-filled holiday can also be stressful and demanding. Here are three tips to help you create a peaceful and harmonious holiday around the dining room table.

Use the "Good Stuff." Thanksgiving is not the time to eat in front of the TV. Bring out the china, crystal, silver, etc. you have been "saving." The dining room is considered to be a place of wealth in Feng Shui, so if you have one, be sure to use it for Thanksgiving dinner. Hang a mirror that reflects your beautifully decorated table and you will symbolically double your abundance and prosperity.

Encourage Family Harmony. Display a centerpiece of orange flowers to encourage conversation, or use a cornucopia with fresh fruit and vegetables to represent good health and longevity. Keep shiny surfaces to a minimum, and stow the carving knife out of sight after you carve the turkey. Be sure to remove photos of deceased relatives or animals from the room because these can create health problems if you dine in their presence. If your family is prone to arguments, keep the yang energy to a minimum by inviting an even number of guests, keeping the lights low, and decorating with earthy colors like pumpkin, goldenrod, evergreen, and chocolate.

Choose Harmonious Foods. The winter months are part of the yin side of our energy, so we need to balance this darker, lower, colder energy with strong yang energy in our Thanksgiving menus. Cooked foods, spices, and hot foods such as chile peppers, ginger, garlic, and chocolate are yang energy. Lighter foods like raw vegetables, potatoes, and fish are yin and are better used in moderation during this period. Feng Shui is all about balance, so serve "white" foods like those mashed potatoes in bright colored plates and bowls.

Holiday Gift Guide

Six Gifts to Avoid Giving



Looking for those perfect Christmas gifts or Hanukkah presents for your family and friends? Be careful what you choose because your gifts may have hidden meaning in Feng Shui terms. Here are six gifts NOT to give this holiday season because of negative Feng Shui:

- 1. Sharp Objects.** Never give knives, scissors, letter openers, or can openers as gifts since they represent cutting a relationship.
- 2. Empty Wallet.** Avoid giving an empty wallet, purse, or briefcase because it represents the lack of prosperity.
- 3. Thorny Flowers and Plants.** Never give cactus or other spiky plants, and avoid giving roses with the thorns still on the stems because these can pierce a relationship.
- 4. Stunted Trees and Plants.** Bonsai trees or other miniature plants make poor choices as gifts since they represent stunted growth.
- 5. Clocks and Timepieces.** Gifts that show time symbolize a limited life span or stealing time from others.
- 6. Handkerchiefs.** It is best to avoid giving handkerchiefs because they symbolize wiping away tears and could suggest that you expect the recipient to be doing a lot of crying in the future.

Get Organized For Stress-Free Holidays



Are you already overwhelmed by your holiday "to-do" list? One way to avoid stress is to simplify the gift giving process, and save money at the same time. Professional Organizer Hazel Thornton of [Organized For Life](#) offers these tips for organizing your holiday gift shopping:

- Shop early in the season.
- Make a list of what you bought so you don't forget what you have.
- Shop early in the day and on weekdays to avoid lines, or purchase gifts online or from catalogs.
- Shop with a list of ideas so you can avoid aimlessly wandering the mall.
- Keep gifts in a central location rather than scattered throughout your home.
- Shop alone, because research shows that you'll spend more if you shop with friends, children, or your spouse.
- Buy multiples of gifts you like for several people on your list.
- Buy a few general presents for those unexpected guests who come bearing gifts.
- Give gifts that don't add clutter to the recipients home, including movie passes, museum memberships, tickets to musical performances, certificates for movie rentals, certificates for sessions with a professional organizer -- and of course gift certificates for sessions with a Feng Shui Practitioner.



Ask the Feng Shui Maven

Q: Where is the best place to store records of paid off debts, debts currently owed, and other important financial papers that you just can't get rid of? The wealth is certainly not flowing in since I lost my job, but the debts sure are, so I would like to make sure that I'm not encouraging it. I have them stored in a file cabinet in the closet, but that's the Wealth area of our home. Can I store them in the attic?

A: When you keep paperwork related to debt visible on your desk or even in the room where you conduct your job search it can have a negative effect. And things that you store in your attic weigh down on you so that's not a good place either. In Feng Shui, you "are what you see" so if you are looking at evidence of your debit it can have a negative effect on the energy around you. Keep these documents stored in a file cabinet so you don't have to look at them everyday. Better yet, scan the documents so you have an electronic record, then shred the originals. To help in your job search, surround yourself with artwork with images that feel wealthy, abundant, and prosperous; that is, how you will feel when you land the perfect new job. If you are targeting a specific company be sure to display their logo in the room where you conduct your job search. Be sure to remove any images that feel negative or have any association with unpleasant times in your life.

Q: I'm divorced and my children want a photo of their father, my ex-husband, in the house. Is this a good idea?

A: While it's not a good idea for your ex-spouse's photo to occupy a prominent position in the public areas of your home, his photos can certainly be displayed in each child's room. Try to make sure that it's a current photo of your ex doing something fun with each child.

Q: What's the Feng Shui opinion of re-gifting?

A: Re-gifting is definitely Feng Shui-friendly because it removes things you don't want from your home and sends them to a place where they are welcome. Just be sure to avoid re-gifting if you have negative feelings about the gift or its original giver, since you might be passing along your negative thoughts to the next recipient.


